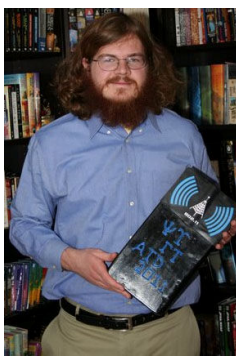

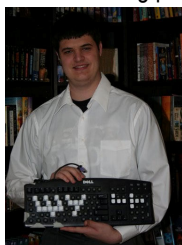

**Jairo Zapata**

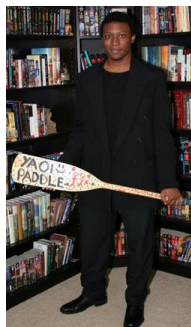

Jay Quincy Belmon

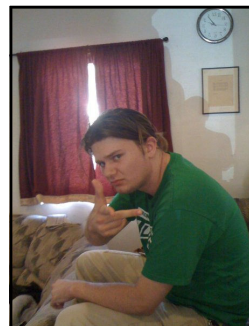
